## AFFIRMATION OF GEORGE E. PATAKI

GEORGE E. PATAKI, being duly sworn, hereby deposes and says:

- I am an attorney duly licensed in the State of New York and, from 1995 to 2006, I served as Governor of the State of New York. I affirm the following to be true under penalty of perjury.
- 2. As Governor, I chaired the Public Authorities Control Board ("PACB") and possessed veto power over Long Island Power Authority ("LIPA") projects.
- 3. On July 16, 1997, I announced the PACB decision approving the transition from LILCO to LIPA. I believed the transition would reduce high utility rates on Long Island and stated that:
  - "... the Long Island Power Authority (LIPA) takeover of the Long Island Lighting Company (LILCO) will guarantee utility rate reductions of 14 percent, retain reliability of service, permit competition in the electric industry, remove the threat of additional tax liabilities and close out existing tax certiorari cases." *See* Exhibit "A", annexed hereto.
- 4. My decision was based heavily on assurances made to me in my role as Governor and chairman of the PACB by LIPA Chair Richard Kessel, LIPA outside counsel Arthur Kremer, individual LIPA board members and the generating companies that, if the transition was approved by the PACB, LIPA would not remove power generating facilities from the tax rolls, prosecute then pending tax certiorari actions or file future tax certiorari actions under the agreements submitted to PACB for approval unless the governmental assessing entity altered the assessment criteria in a way different from the last two years prior to the 1997 agreement.

5. I respectfully request that any Court considering these issues give appropriate deference to the administrative decision I made which was joined in by Senate President Joseph Bruno and Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver, and announced on July 16, 1997, as reflected in the minutes of the PACB.

Governor Pataki called the meeting to order at 2:02 p.m. and directed the presentation of the materials on the agenda.

WHEREUPON, the minutes of the June 18,1997 meeting were approved.

WHEREUPON, there was discussion on the following item:

97-LI-001

APPROVING CERTAIN SPECIFIED PROJECTS OF THE LONG ISLAND POWER AUTHORITY

The Governor's opening comments addressed the considerable time and effort spent over many years and governors attempting to provide lower utility rates for Long Island. He said that this issue has been talked about for more than a decade and now we are getting beyond talk and taking the action that will finally provide benefits to the people of Long Island. He then thanked past and current LIPA Chairmen James Gill, Frank Zarb and Richard Kessel for their efforts, as well as Lou Tomson.

Governor Pataki continued to discuss the burden of high utility rates and how the Long Island Power Authority (LIPA) takeover of the Long Island Lighting Company (LILCO) will guarantee utility rate reductions of 14 percent, retain reliability of service, permit competition in the electric industry, remove the threat of additional tax liabilities and close out existing tax certiorari cases. The LIPA-LILCO pact includes settlement of several lawsuits filed by the utility companies that could have forced Long Island communities to repay more than \$1 billion in property tax overcharges. The Governor indicated that LILCO and Brooklyn Union, as part of the agreement, will invest \$1.3 billion in the Long Island service area over the next ten years.

Sheldon Silver, Speaker of the Assembly, then indicated his intent to vote in favor of the LIPA-LILCO agreement, mentioning his reservations about the size of the debt involved, but also citing the need to take advantage of the IRS tax waiver written into Federal law. Speaker Silver further stated that this resolution provides assurances, including a specific rate reduction guarantee and measures to create competition among Long Island power suppliers and other enhancements, all without compromising the safety or reliability of the delivery system. He also stated that \$1.3 billion in energy related infrastructure improvements will be undertaken by LILCO and Brooklyn Union in Suffolk and Nassau counties.

Senator Bruno stated he was pleased that the Speaker is supportive of the resolution and that his vote will resolve problems that have plagued Long Islanders for years, related to the excessive utility rates there. Senator Bruno indicated his intent to vote for the LIPA-LILCO PACB resolution because it is the right thing to do for Long Island and the State, and that this action will fix the Shoreham mistake made years ago.

WHEREUPON, the Members being all present, a vote was taken, and by motion made and seconded, the resolution was unanimously approved.

WHEREUPON, the Governor called a brief recess.

At 2:35 p.m. the meeting was called back to order with Judith Kenny representing Patricia Woodworth as Chair and voting members Roman Hedges representing Speaker Sheldon Silver and Abe Lackman representing Senator Joseph Bruno. Nonvoting members Senator William T. Stachowski and Assemblyman George Winner were also present.

WHEREUPON, there was discussion regarding the following item:

APPROVING A SPECIFIED PROJECT OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL FACILITIES CORPORATION (State Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund - Short-Term Direct Loan)

Mr. Lackman asked Mr. Gebhardt of EFC for the total cost of the project, which the Bronx Community Paper Company proposes to construct at the Harlem River Yard. Mr. Gebhardt responded that approximately \$570 million would ultimately be financed by private activity bonds, grant monies and equity capital. Mr. Lackman also inquired about the proposed timeframe for construction of the environmental components of the project. Mr. Gebhardt responded that this would probably occur this fall, before frost could impede the work. Mr. Lackman further asked if the required permits and approvals were in place, to which Mr. Gebhardt indicated the final Environmental Impact Statement was issued in December 1993 and a Record of Decision was issued in 1994.

A vote was taken and, by motion made and seconded, the resolution was adopted.

WHEREUPON, the Members or their representatives being all present, a vote was taken, and by motion made and seconded, it was unanimously:
